Entry Fees

- DWRC members who book at least two classes prior to the show at £6 per class, can enter more classes on the day at the same price. Entries made on the day only will be £7.50 per class for adults. Youth members booking in advance will pay £4.50 & the same on the day for extra classes. Youth members not paying in advance will pay £6 per class. All non-members will pay £8 per class, but block full bookings in advance will be given a discount.

Information for Competitors

- Classes will be judged under DWRC competition rules.
- All WES Affiliated Classes will be run under WES Rules - refer to WES Rule Book. These classes are open to all (Class 8/18/25).
- WES members must check their points before entering WES Affiliated Classes.
- WES Novice Horse or Rider must be below 36 points from January 2010.
- WES Affiliated Classes are open to all members & are not restricted to WES members only.
- All DWRC Members, if you have not already got a club points card, please pick one up on the day from the show desk. Cards must be signed by the show Manager or Show Secretary on the day to receive end of year Hi Points.
- In Hand Trail Classes will be held in the main arena
- Only current fully paid up members of the DWRC are eligible for Hi point & other trophies & awards.
- Please be on time for your classes to keep the show running smoothly.
- DWRC Members must check your points to confirm your correct category so you know which classes you are able to compete in.
- Novice Riders & Horses may enter those classes if they have less than 20 points in that event as of January 2010.
- DWRC Members with more than 20 points but less than 40 are restricted to intermediate classes in that specific class.
- DWRC Members that have more than 40 points in any one category are restricted to Open & Senior Classes.
- Other restricted Members may enter classes HC but must declare this to the judge. It will depend on class numbers. Members riding HC may not wear competition numbers in the ring.
- A FULL LIST OF DWRC POINTS UPDATED FOR 2010 WILL BE ON DISPLAY & MAY BE REQUESTED FROM THE SHOW MANAGER BY POST (SEND SAE PLEASE).

Conditions of Entry

- Neither the Devon Western Riding Club or owners or employees of The Centre for Caring Horsemanship nor any members of the show management team shall be held responsible for any loss, damage or expense incurred to any person or horse at the show from whatever the cause arising. All entries shall be at the sole risk of the competitors.
- All persons attending the show must take sufficient care in the safety of themselves & their property.

- All riders must wear a hard hat at all times when mounted - properly adjusted & fastened - approved to the current British Safety Standards.
- English tack can be used in walk & jog classes but Western Split reins must be used.
- The organizers reserve the right to amend the schedule at any time or to refuse entries without explanation.
- Any rider/handler deemed to have lost control of their horse may be asked to leave the ring/collecting area by the Show Manager Team. There will be no refund of entries fees.
- All complaints must be lodged with the Show Manager before the end of the show together with a fee of £20. If the complaint is upheld the fee will be refunded. The complaint will be put before the Show Manager & the DWRC Committee; all parties concerned will be interviewed. The complaint & outcome will be logged in the Show Manager Manual.

Directions for the Centre of Caring Horsemanship:

A30 come off at WHIDDON DOWN JUNCTION. Follow the signs to Whiddon Down – past the service station on the right, take the turning for North Tawton/Spreyton on the right opposite the pub. Follow the North Tawton road for approx. 1.5 miles and The Centre for Caring Horsemanship is on your right. Enter after the signs and park where directed.
